Dr. Gordon Frankie is professor & research entomologist, UC Berkeley

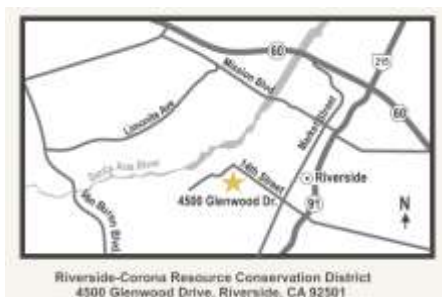
